## what's new?



#### **Middle School Mentors**

20 young adults from the Midian Leadership Project and Step by Step, Inc. (most of whom are West Siders) spent a week this past school year at West Side Middle School giving support to students and extra support for staff and teachers. The work led to a Congressional Earmark request for \$200,000 to support the growth of long-term mentor initiatives at West Side Middle.

#### Westside Youth Works!

Last summer, 9 West Side students were hired by West Side organizations: NEW WV, Midian Leadership Project, Aspire Achievement Project, Restorative Actions, and Phat Daddy's on Da Tracks. The program included meet-ups for students to socialize and to learn job skills and financial management. This model is under review to extend the City of Charleston's summer youth employment program into neighborhoods.



## what's the word?

This Spring and Summer, the Westside Together outreach team knocked on over 3,300 doors in the Flats and on the Hill. The team was able to connect with 615 homes to see how folks are doing, identify neighborhood priorities, and learn how West Siders would like to get involved in the community. Resident input is already being used to guide neighborhood improvements and connect neighbors to opportunities and resources.

## **Kanawha Dreamers Family Support Center**







Step By Step started the Family Support Center in 2019 to bring opportunities and resources to West Side families. In Spring of 2022, they moved the operation to its own building across the street from Risen

Katie Bonham, the Director of the Center shares that while the food pantry has been open longer, less neighbors are aware of what else is offered here and how accessible it is.

"People are actually really shocked at how easy it is. We operate on trust," Katie said.

The center is easy to use and doesn't require ID or proof of household size all that's required is about 5 minutes to

complete an intake form. Then, families are set for life to walk in during regular hours. As well as access to weekly food pantry, hygiene, and baby product bags, neighbors can do laundry loads, pick out clothes from their closet, and get a hot shower throughout the week.

#### "We have been told we have the hottest showers on the West Side!"

They also have computers and a printer with assistance on hand.

"If someone [needs help with computers], we will help them—read the information to them or help them navigate online."

This Spring and Fall, the Center will host more resource fairs focused on physical

and mental health. In April, the FSC will celebrate how much it has brought to the neighborhood in its first year.
